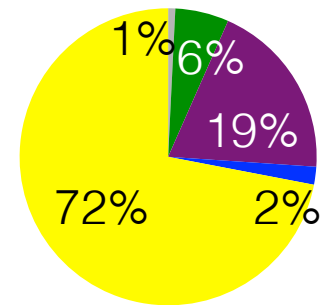

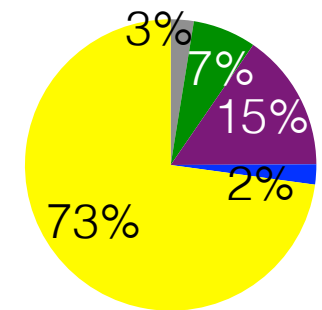

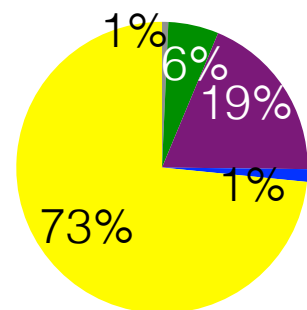
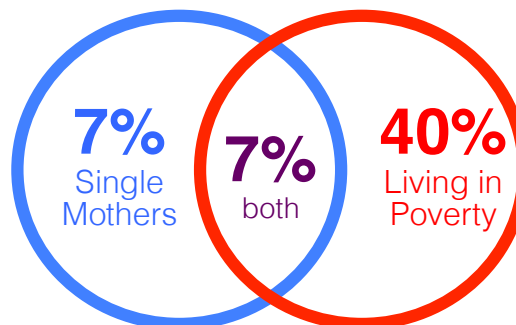

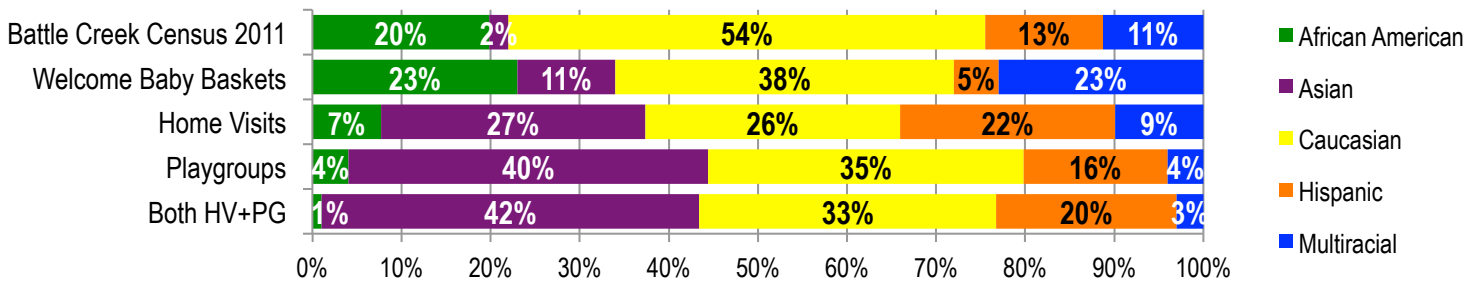

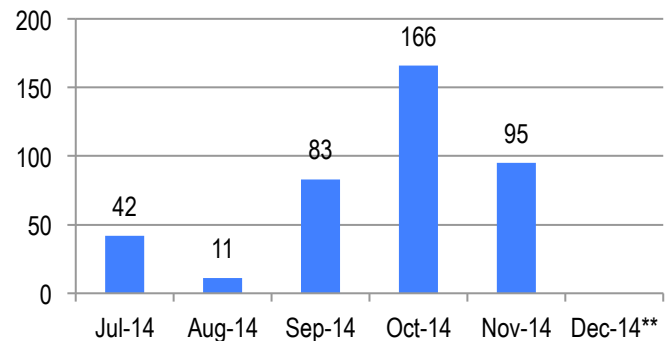

¹ Basic service referrals are to organizations including the Burma Center, Charitable Union, SAFE Place, Voces; Community service referrals are to 211, Community Action; Education service referrals are to Birth to Six, Early On; and Health service referrals are to Family Health Center, Healthcare Connections.

² Most common medical homes were Northside Pediatrics and Family Health Center. Those without identified doctor's office were primarily from the Burmese community.

Most common referral sources to EC Connections programming: Health organizations (e.g., Bronson Battle Creek, Bronson Kalamazoo, Connect Health Services); ECC visits/playgroups/car seat; Events (e.g., Maranda's Park Party, school open houses); and CBOs (e.g., Charitable Union, Voces).

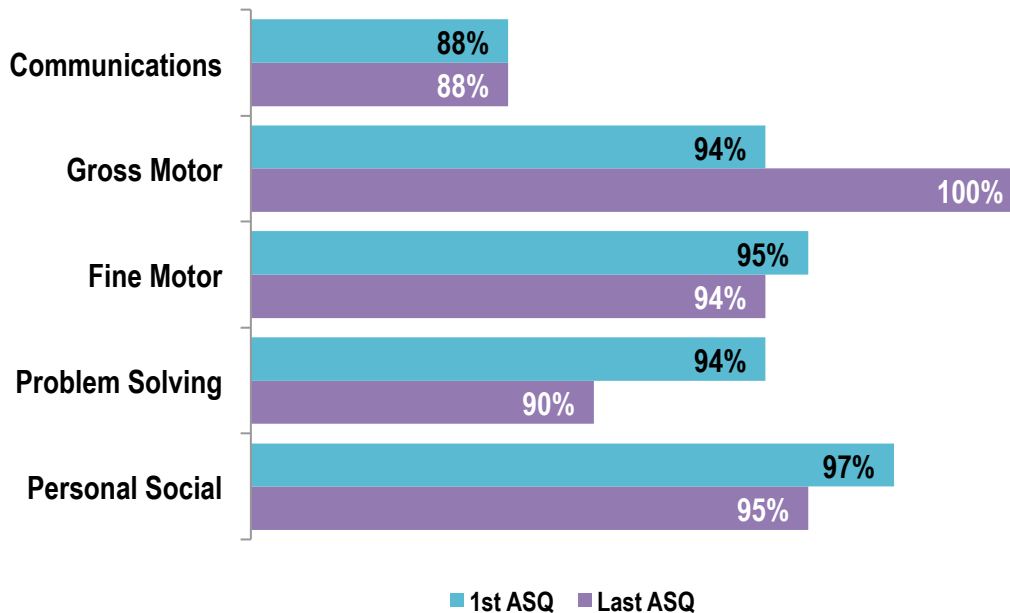
Ages & Stages Questionnaire

Since ASQ scores have been tracked in the B25 system, 422 children have had ASQ scores entered for them, with a total of 797 ASQs conducted.

There are 108 children who had their 2nd ASQ in 2014, so those are the children reported on below (their first ASQ occurred between 2011 and 2014). The average age increase between the 1st ASQ and the most recent ASQ was 15 months. For these 108 children, the chart below the table illustrates what percentage of children were developmentally on target in each area at their 1st ASQ and their most recent ASQ.
